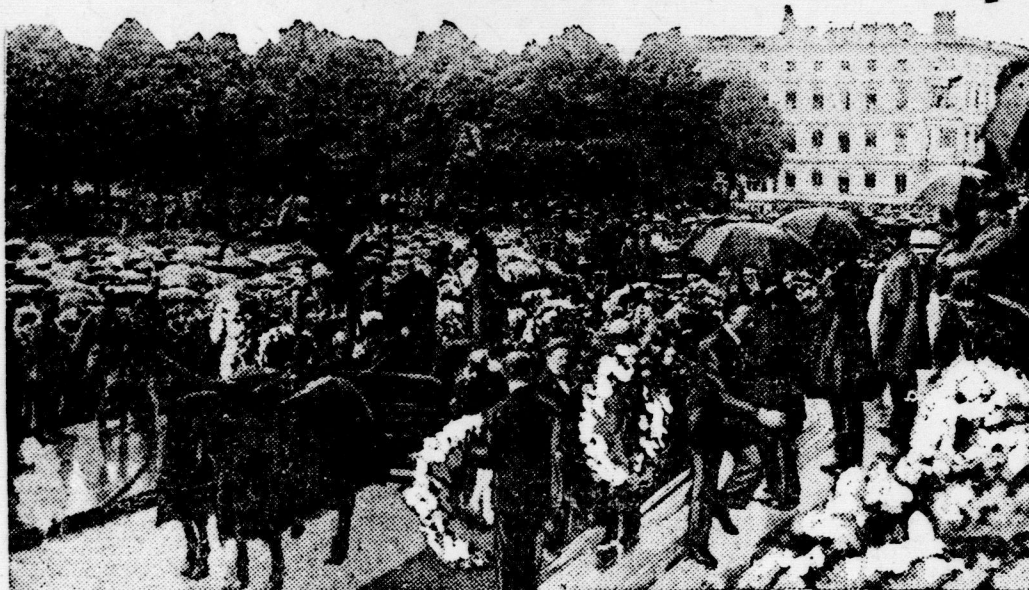

Blind Oarsmen Win Race.



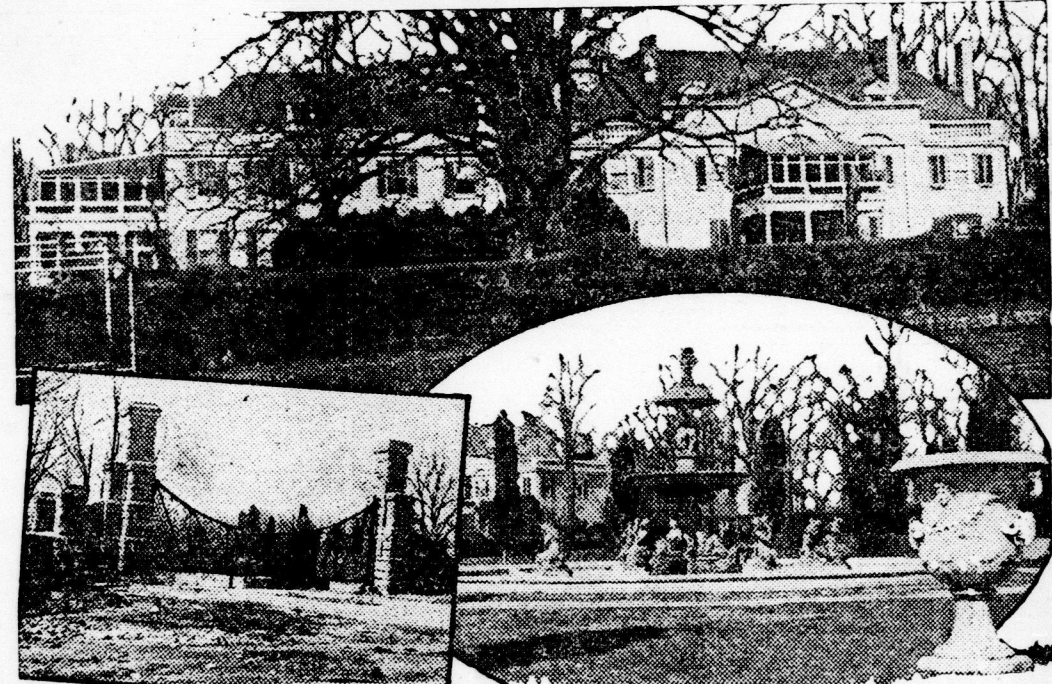
TWO war blinded heroes won honors in one of the events at St. Dunstan's regatta recently held at Putney, England. They were coached by a woman.

Prince of Wales Gets Back to Old Sport.



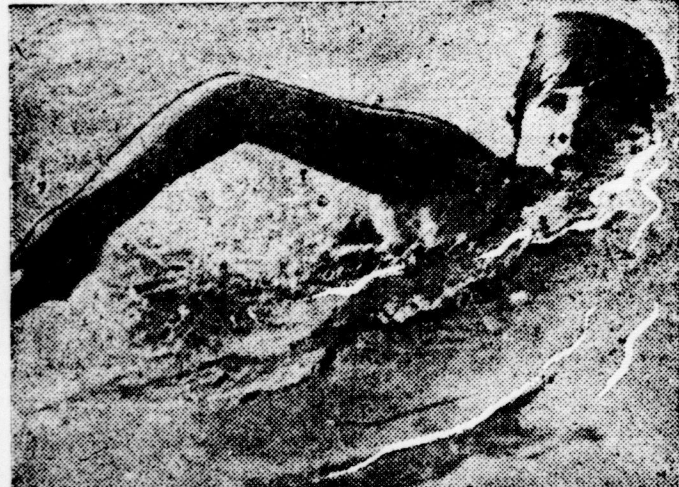

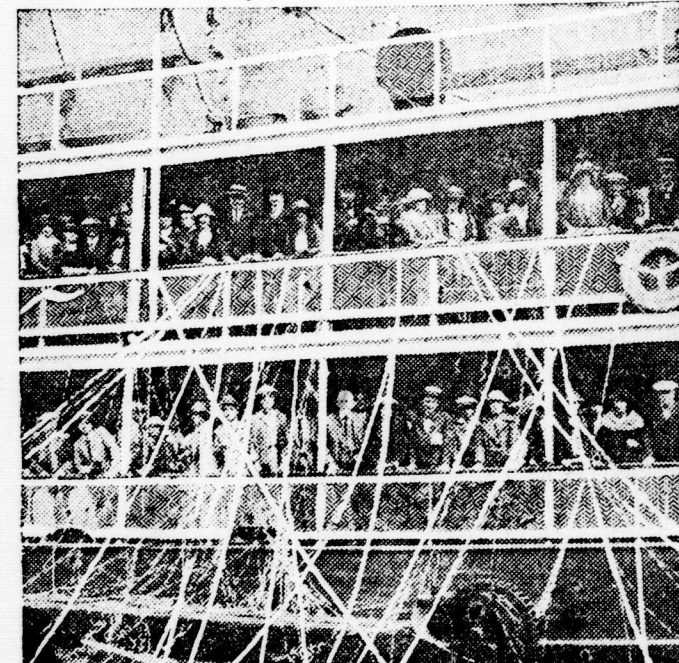
LI YUAN-HUNG, new president of China, is making vigorous efforts to unite the faction-split country. He was vice-president of the republic in 1916.

Unique Convention Hall.



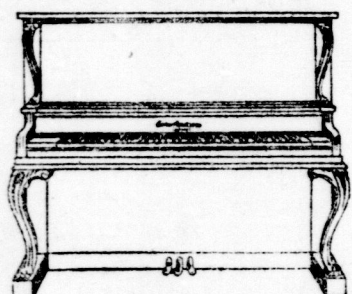
