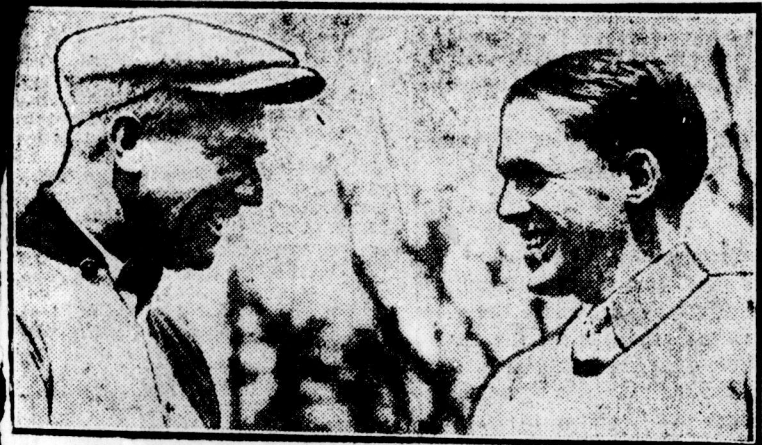

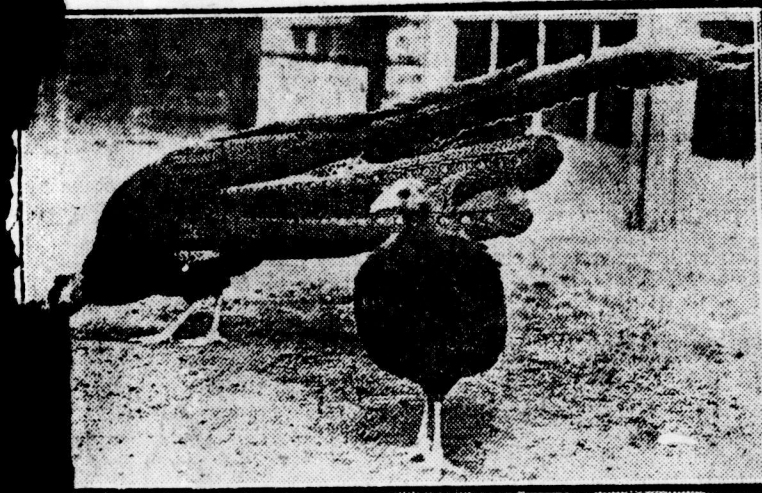

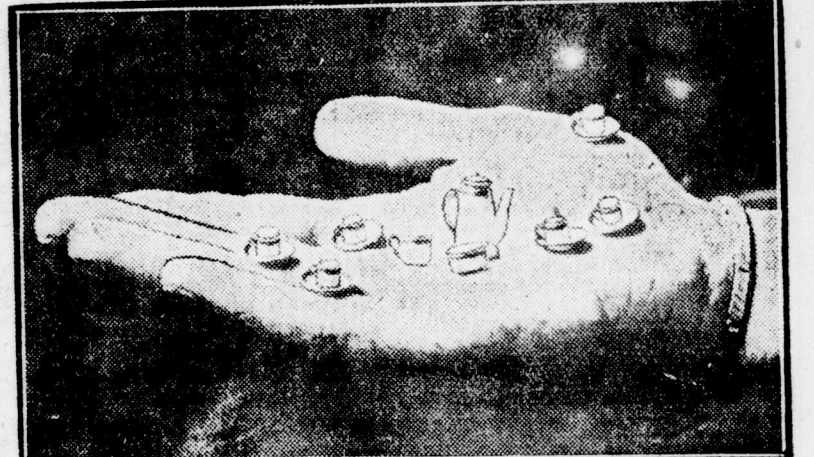
Miss Lillian Scott, of Toronto, won first prize for her costume at the Shriners' masquerade ball held recently in the Queen City



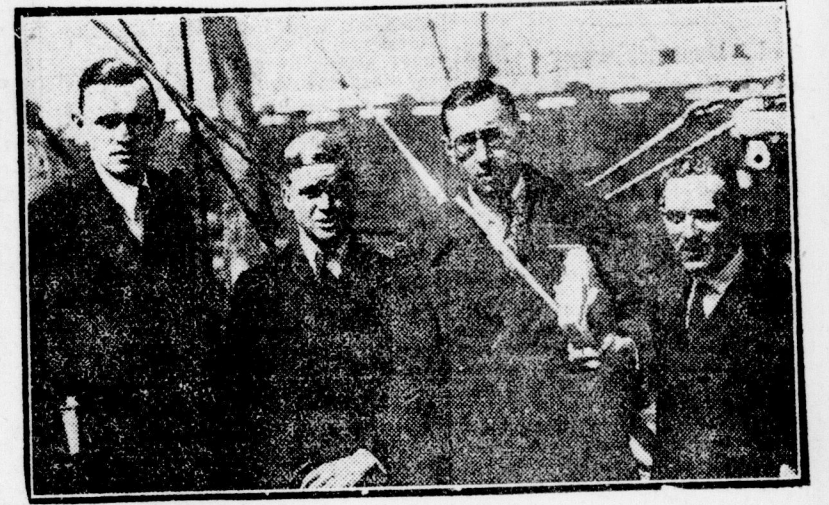

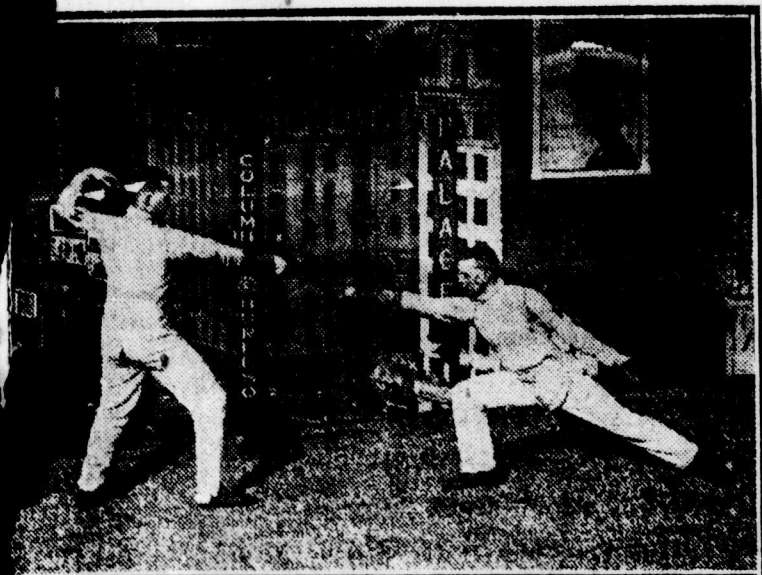

Here are some of the small pieces of china used for the Queen's doll house, which are actual replicas of genuine china sets, but made in one-twelfth regular size



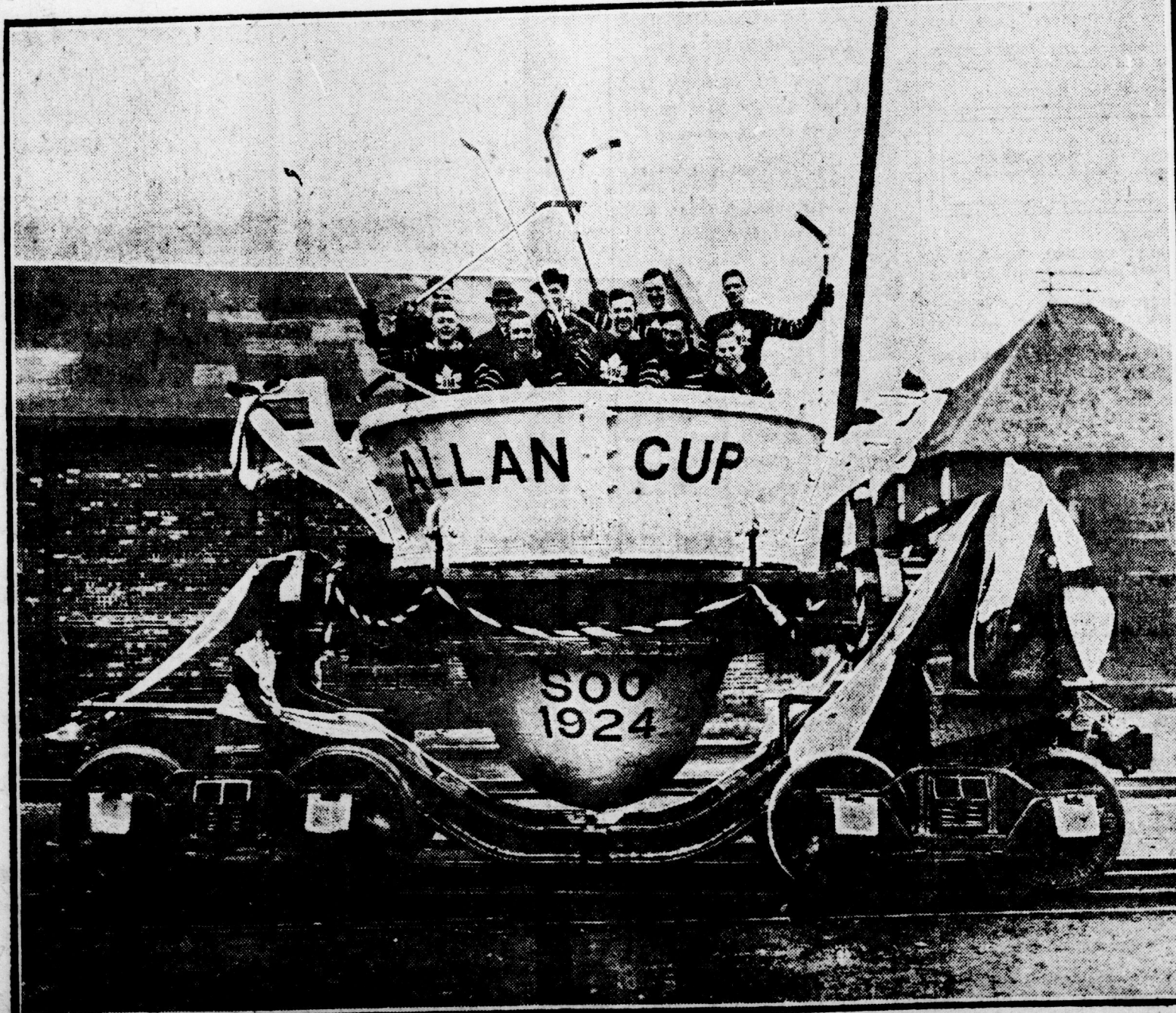
This group of men have left for South America, where they will traverse unexplored territory for the Hoatzin bird, which is said to swim like a fish, fly like a bat and break stones with its bill
