Neptune Smashes Dover Harbor LONDON, Dec. 22.—It is feared that the \$20,000,000 spent by the Admiralty on the improvement of Dover Harbor has been wasted. There is to-day a rushing tide rip across the

harbor entrance which makes it next to impossible to enter at certain stages of the tide.

It has also been found that the harbor silts up very rapidly, in spite of the fact that \$350,000 are spent annually on dredging. Altogether, Dover Harbor has cost the lation \$50,000,000, and many millions more will have to be spent if it is to be of any use to the larger ships of the navy.
