# TWO GANGS OF DRUG-BURGLARS CAPTURED

Drug Stores and Hotels This Trio's Specialty.

HAD RANSACKED A SCORE OF PLACES

Stole Perfumery, Champagne, Cigars and Cash.

The Detectives Recover About \$600 Worth of Property, Part of Which Had Been Held to a Ring-Street Burglar—When They Were Caught by the Trio.

During the past few weeks burglars have been unusually numerous in the city. The chief characteristic of the robbers was their boldness and the fact that they were confined to drug stores and hotel bar-rooms. On several occasions where the attempts to break in had been frustrated, owing to their having roused the household, it was discovered a few days later that the place had been "burled." Apart from this seemingly reckless but practically successful during the execution of the jobs were certainly not "spare" affairs. The latter part was proved to demonstration by the frequency with which the thieves missed come-at-able valuables that would inevitably have been secured by burglar. Extraneous was usually obtained by the rough-and-ready method of forcing doors and windows with a jimmy, or breaking out the glass.

As the burglars went on unchecked the detectives naturally began to feel crestfallen over them. They had worked very hard in the endeavor to achieve success—harder than they had done in any other cases in which they had secured brilliant success. Where defeat came in was in the failure to trace any of the stolen property. They hunted the pawnshops and drug stores with an earnestness worthy of any cause, and kept a specially sharp lookout upon the establishments of known or suspected retailers of stolen property.

Johnson, druggist, King and Peter-streets; E. Kennedy, druggist, McCall and Queen-streets; J. D. Matheson, druggist, 142 King-street west; John Armstrong British Hotel, King and Simco-streets, (robbed on three occasions within a few days); James O'Donohue, (Shakespeare Hotel, Wellington and York-streets); Mrs. Julia McGee, (Garden City Hotel, Adelaide and Bay-streets); George Proctor, (Hay Tree Hotel, Adelaide and Bay-streets); W. H. Haakin, (Kerby House, Queen and William-streets); Joseph Fitzgerald's Hotel, Queen and Simco-streets; William Morrison's cigar store, 36 Queen west.

At the various drug stores which were visited hair and tooth brushes, perfumery, pills and patent medicines were stolen from the bottles, corks, whistles and money. The manner in which the two wholesale druggists were swindled was unique.
