## PATCHEN DEFEATS ROBERT J.

FOUR HEATS TO DECIDE THE CHAMPIONSHIP RACE AT BUFFALO.

The Third Looked Like a Dead Heat, but the Judges gave it to Patchen's champion. The Best Time Was 2:04.15.

Five Races Decided in One Day.

Buffalo, Aug. 8.—For the third time this year, Joe Patchen defeated Robert J. To-day the game son of Patchen's Wilkes convincingly demonstrated his superiority over the little known but powerful champion.
