

Cansoke , facing the frowning cliff ; Canso.	Insakoomādeedich , Lakeland, N.S.
Caskumpec , flowing through the sand ; Cascumpec, P. E. Island.	Kabēm , the border of a lake.
Caydybunnygek , clam diggings ; Boot Island, Horton.	Kägwēamkēk , Port Hood.
Chebookt , Halifax, from Ükchebookt, the largest harbor or bay.	Kakagwēk , a place of dried meat ; now Hantsport, in Hants Co.
Cheemā , to paddle a canoe.	Käkwōleegigdū , a snow-bank.
Chegaoō , bass, a fish.	Käleboo , caribou.
Chegūmakūn , a rattle, an Indian tambourine.	Kaleboode , a shovel. Hence Kalēboo , caribou, the shoveller, because they shovel up the snow with their broad feet in digging down for the moss on which they feed.
Chijikwtook' , Cornwallis River.	Katkooch' and Katkoolch' , Brooklyn, Queens Co., Nova Scotia.
Chikchowwegūnēchwā'-wōso-wēk' , a rose.	Keäskūno'gwējīt , a mighty chopper, a fabulous being who cuts down trees ; you hear the chopping, the workman is invisible, but the tree falls.
Chikchowwegūnējul , roseberries ; also the name of an orange.	Kēbamkeāk' , Bathurst, on the Bay of Chaleur.
Chipchowwēch' , a robin.	Kēbāpskitk , the stream that connects two lakes.
Cwesomallygeek , Hardwood Ridge, Cumberland.	The six lakes on the Liverpool River, as you go up stream :
Ebēdēk , Bedeque, P. E. Island.	1. Panook .
Ēlmūnākūncheech , Little Sevogal River.	2. Kēdooskēk' .
Ēlsētkook' , Bear River in Nova Scotia.	3. Pushūgook' .
Ēmsūk , Port Joli.	4. Kējimkoojik .
Eppayguit , anchored on the wave ; Prince Edward Island.	5. Imūtkaak .
Ēskūmāāgā , to eat raw flesh ; hence the name of the eskimo Indians, eaters of raw flesh.	6. Toobeadooogook .
Ēskūmūnaak' , Mount Skumunāk.	Lakes on Salmon River, east of Halifax :
Ēskūmūnaak' , Point Skimenack, in New Brunswick.	1. Ūsoogomūsoogwēdāmk' .
Ēskwōdēk' , Murray Harbor, P.E.I.	2. Milpāāchk .
Ēspaktūmegēk , high land. Green Hill, Pictou County.	3. Utkoskwāāchk .
Gaspēch , Gaspé; far into the water.	4. Kloocheowpāāchk .
Glooscap , a manitou who dwelt in the Bay of Fundy, at Blomidon.	5. Nēmchenokpāāchk .
Goolwagōpskooch , Port George.	6. Noogoomkūbāāk .
Gul-wahgahgek , the home of the sea-cow ; Quaco, New Brunswick.	7. Mtābēs-wāākādē (where mud-catfish abound).
