## THE POULTRY SHOW AT THE INDUSTRIAL.

During the second week of the Industrial Fair, held in Toronto, in the month of September last, a visit was paid to the poultry exhibit, which was up to the high standard of excellence. The same excellent arrangements for accomodation, care and feeding of the stock so conspicuous the previous year were again noticed. At a meeting of the Ontario Poultry Association, held in one of the rooms above the main offices, upon invitation of the president, a short address was made, in which the progress of the work carried on at the Central Experimental Farm was described.

## THE WILD GEESE...

At the beginning of May, the wild geese were removed to runs outside, where they had access to tanks of water. They had apparently "paired", and the two pairs were placed in separate runs. Soon after one of the geese laid an egg, which was followed by three others. Two of the eggs were placed under a large Brahma hen, which was broody at the time, and the goose was allowed to sit on the remaining two, but did not sit contentedly, the nest being evidently in too exposed a place, and the eggs did not hatch. One of the eggs under the Brahma hen proved unfertilized, while the other, at the end of 28 days, was found to contain a full-sized gosling, but dead in the shell.
