MANITOBA.—The next meeting of this Presbytery will be held at Winnipeg and within the church there on the 10th day of September, at 11 o'clock, a.m.

Commercial.

PRODUCE. The market has been very firm all week, but as there was very little of either flour or grain offering, trade has been quiet.

FLOUR.—The market has been very poorly supplied, and prices have been tending upwards all week. Last week No. 1 super. sold at \$5.35.

WHEAT.—Has been in good demand at firm prices. On Saturday a lot of 5,000 bushels of No. 1 spring and 5,000 bushels of mixed fall sold at \$1.27 f.o.b. all round.

OATS.—There has been very little offered all week, and prices have advanced. Chicago sold last week at 40c. f.o.c., and on Tuesday at 41c. f.o.c.

BARLEY.—Reports of the new crop agree in saying that the yield will be about two-thirds to three-fourths that of last year, in consequence of small acreage.

PEAS.—There is nothing doing, values are nominally unchanged at quotations.

CORN.—Car-lots sold last week and on Tuesday at 45c. on the track.

BRAN.—A car sold on Monday at \$12 on the track.

PROVISIONS.

BUTTER.—Is fairly active. Considerable purchases have been made of lots at outside points at prices ranging from 13 to 15c., the latter being for selected.

CHEESE.—Small lots now range from 12 to 13c.

EGGS.—Are plentiful, but vary widely in price; from 10 to 12 1/2c. is paid.

PORK.—A lot of 100 bris. sold at \$17.50, small lots bring \$18.

BACON.—A lot of 600 sides changed hands at 8c.; small lots at 8 1/2 to 8 3/4c. A lot of 300 canvassed hams sold at 13c., lots of 50 at 13 1/4c.

LARD.—There was one lot in tierces sold at 10 1/4c.; small lots firm.

FREIGHTS.

LAKE FREIGHTS.—Rates are unchanged at 2 1/2c. to Kingston, and at 3c. to Oswego.
