The last was the most disastrous season for our Provincial Marine, as it was indeed for that of the entire shipping that navigates the lakes. In the two last months in the year, more casualties occurred than during the previous season, at which period vessels generally were ladened with valuable cargoes, and not a few the insurance on which had expired. These heavy losses, together with the completion of our Railroad system, tend much towards the depreciation in value of all classes of Lake craft.
