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## FACTS ABOUT QUEBEC

Quebee is sitmateid ntont 300 miles from the gulf of St-Lawrence and 180 miles from Montreal, in $46^{\circ}$ 4 4 .30 " North. Latitnde and $71^{\circ} 1219.5$ of Longitude West.

Quebee is the seennd city in point of population in the Province and the third in the Dominion.

It is the most picturesque and most atrongly fortified city on the continent.

It was the ancient capital of Ca nada and is the present capital of the Province.
It is known ns the walled city of the uneth.

It will be 300 years old in 1908.
Quebee was besieged five times, In 1629, by Sir David Kirke; in 1690, by Sir Willinn Phipps; in 1711, by Sir Fovedeu Walker; in 1769, by Admiral Saunders; and in 1775, by General Arnold.
For municipal purposes the City of Quebee is divided into ten warcis. Each of which is represented in the City Council by three aldermen.

'The English, Russian German, trench, Spanish, Italian, Portugueso and Scandinavian are the most po werful languages within the bounds of Christian civilization, because they are the tongues of vigorous people. With the exception of the English these are all indigenous and die if transplanted. The United States is the youngest of powerful countries, yet it is a cemetery of many languages; for instance French, one of the sweetest of tongues, threatened to become the national language. Louisiana was settled by people of the French nation, who brought their language with them and landed it upon that soil in anticipation of its growth. [nsteal, however. of its growing and spreading over the country, it began to weaken :und will soon disappear from the menories of the inhabitants of that state.
It is only necessary to note the population, according to the several langunges, to realize the unchangeable future of the English, now striding
on and on over the face of the carth with wonderful impetuosity and $a$ vigor that will not be restruined.

English is spoken by $90,000,000$ of peopli., Russiun 75,000 000, German $\quad 56,000,000$, French $40,000,000$, Spanish $38,000,000$, Italian 20, 000 , 000 . Portuguese $14,000,000$, and Sandinariam $9,000,000$ Within the control of the goverment of these se. veral languages, England rules over $255,000,000$ of people who do not as y't spenk the English language, and the other seven nations have only 75, 000,000 outsilde of themselvesan astonishing differenee.

Cansidering them by territorial limits, leaving out Rossia, we find he English language to own 13,382, 666 miles German 449, 684, French 571, 578, Spanish $+6,694,511$, Italian 11.4, 466. Portuguese $4,028,311$, and Scanlimavian 1, 308, 830. The aggregate number of sipuare miles, possessed by these six langunges is $11,167,620$, which altogether own $2,215,066 \mathrm{mi}$ les square less than the English. The balance itself is more than Germany. France and Spain put together.-New-York Commercial-Advertiser.
