## **CONCLUSIONS OF THE CHAIR**

## Consensus on basic principles

- Peace and development go hand in hand. 1.
- Conflict prevention is essential, and la Francophonie must commit to it to avoid 2. both terrible human tragedies as well as enormous costs at a time of resource scarcity. It must be recognized that funds spent on humanitarian assistance, conflict management and conflict resolution are funds not spent on development.
- La Francophonie must not develop parallel conflict prevention mechanisms, and 3. should support rather than compete with the Organization of African Unity.
- La Francophonie must better define what can and should be its contribution to 4. conflict prevention - that is, its value-added contribution.

## Practical considerations

- La Francophonie already does many things that are related to conflict prevention but have not always been regarded or perceived as such:
  - programs of the Agency for Cultural and Technical Co-operation (ACCT)
    - to consolidate democracy
    - to promote the rule of law
    - to develop judicial systems
    - to train judges
    - to train journalists
  - activities of the International Association of French-Speaking Parliamentarians (AIPLF)
    - the key role played by parliamentarians, which could be further developed
