

Vicente Fox Quesada

President of Mexico

Vicente Fox Quesada was born on July 2, 1942, in Mexico City. He studied business administration at Ibero-American University and received a diploma in management from Harvard Business School.

In 1964, Mr. Fox began work as a delivery truck route supervisor with the Coca-Cola Group. Ten years later, he was named company president for Mexico and Latin America.

He has also been an official of the Mexican-American Chamber of Commerce and director of a group of companies involved in agriculture and manufacturing.

In the 1980s, after joining the National Action Party, Mr. Fox was elected federal Congressman for the third district of León, Guanajuato. In 1995, he became Governor of the state of Guanajuato. He was elected President of Mexico on July 2, 2000, and took office on Dec. 1, 2000. He has four children.
