Hon. Ray Hnatyshyn (Saskatoon West): I have one minute left in which to speak in this particular debate. I think it is significant that today we have seated across from us, on the Government side, the Minister of National Health and Welfare (Miss Bégin), who is responsible for Family Allowances and is to be the guardian of Family Allowances for the people of Canada, the Minister of Employment and Immigration (Mr. Axworthy), who has a special responsibility to the youth of this country, the Minister of State for Mines (Mrs. Erola) who is responsible for the Status of Women and who should be interested in the plight of women, including single mothers, and the Minister of Labour (Mr. Caccia), who should be interested in the terms of employment opportunities. They have been here and have condoned this atrocious attack on the youth and families of our nation. I simply say, shame on them.
