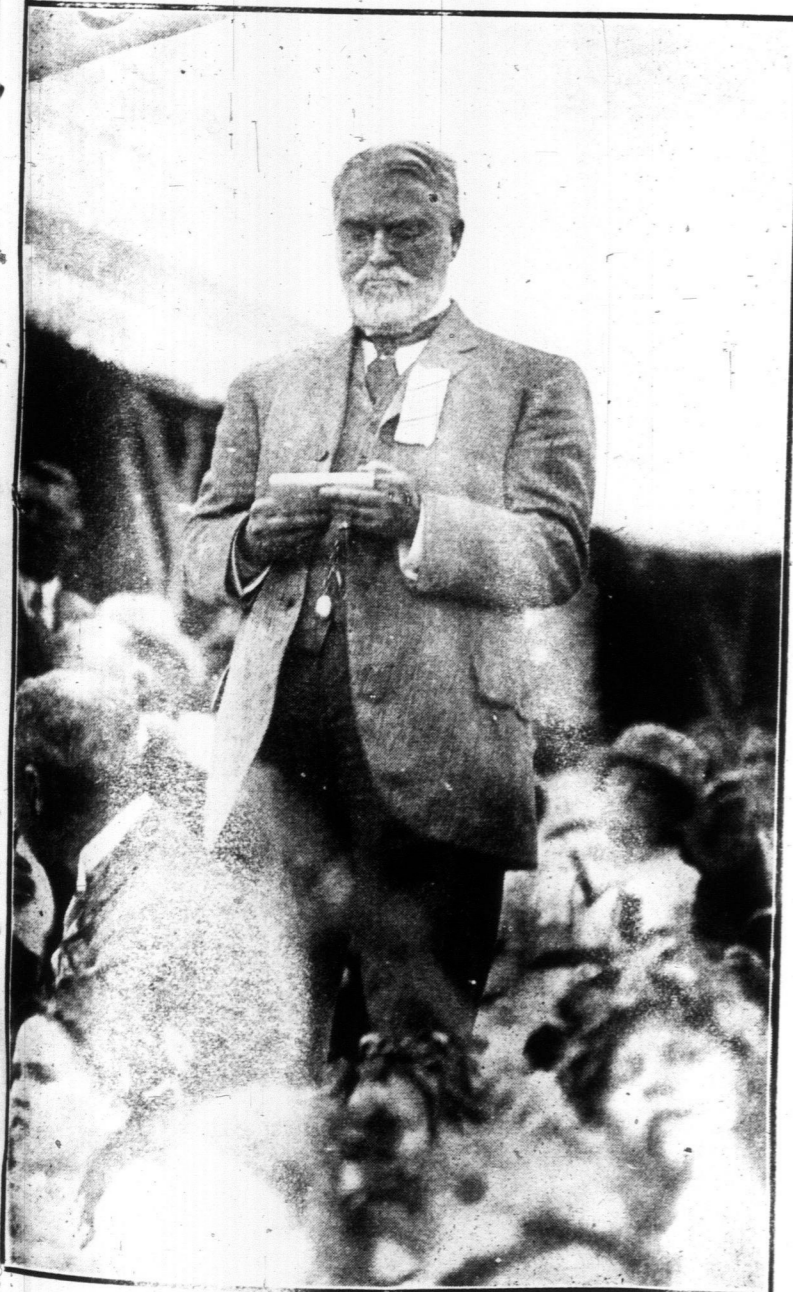

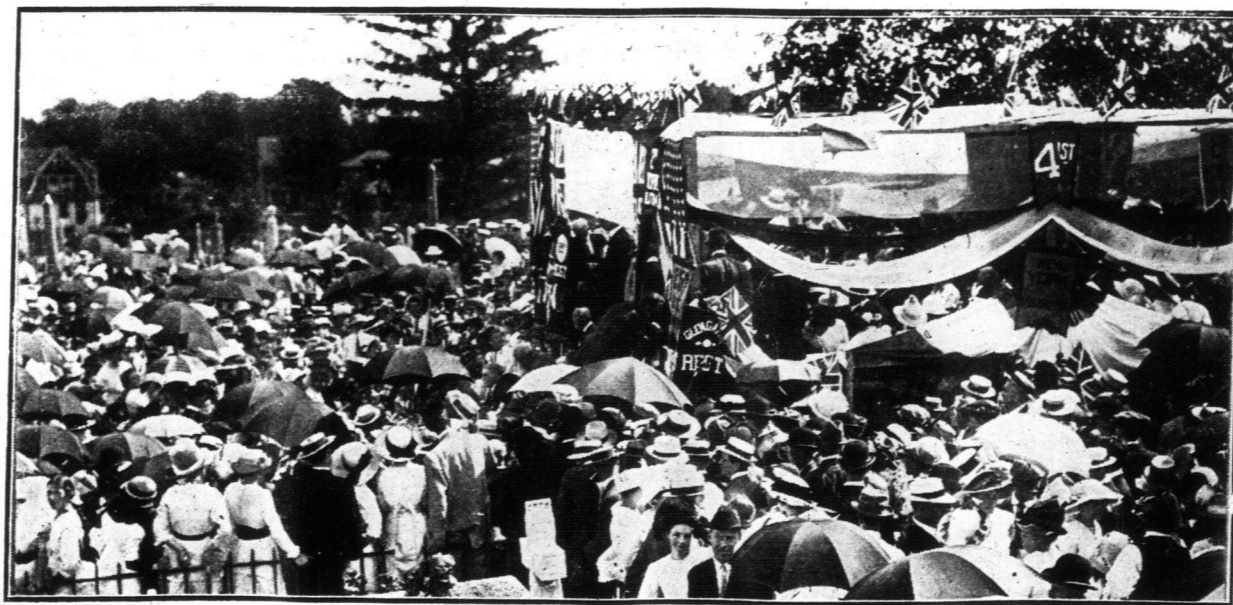
Miss Gertrude Lundy, a direct descendant of the Lundy family, after whom the famous battlefield was named.



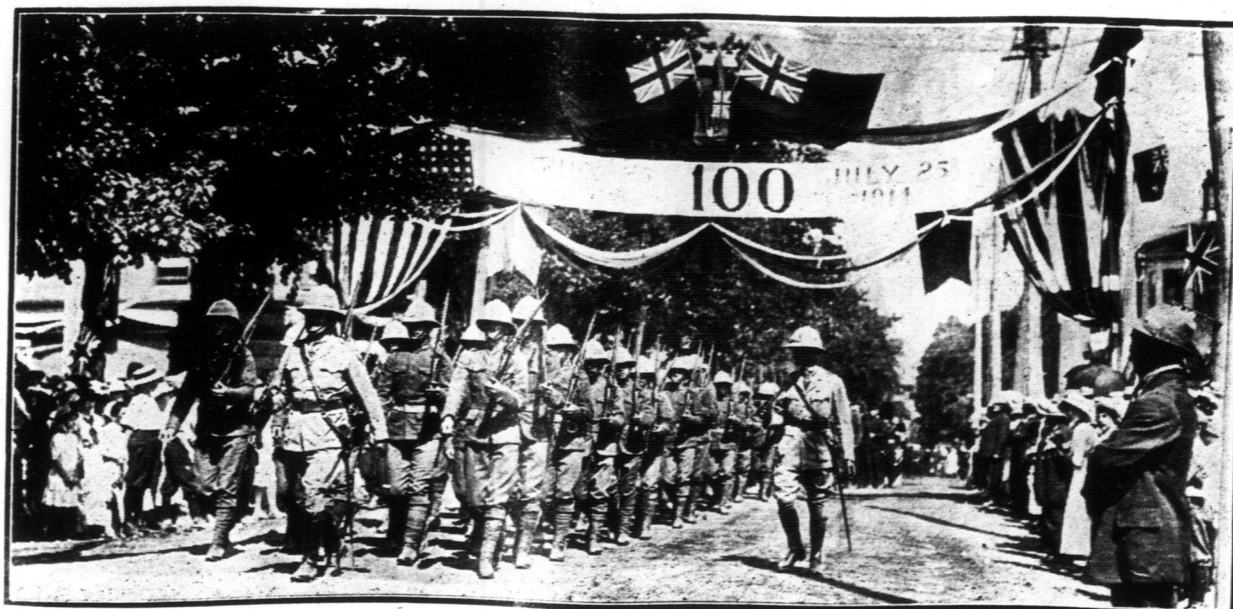

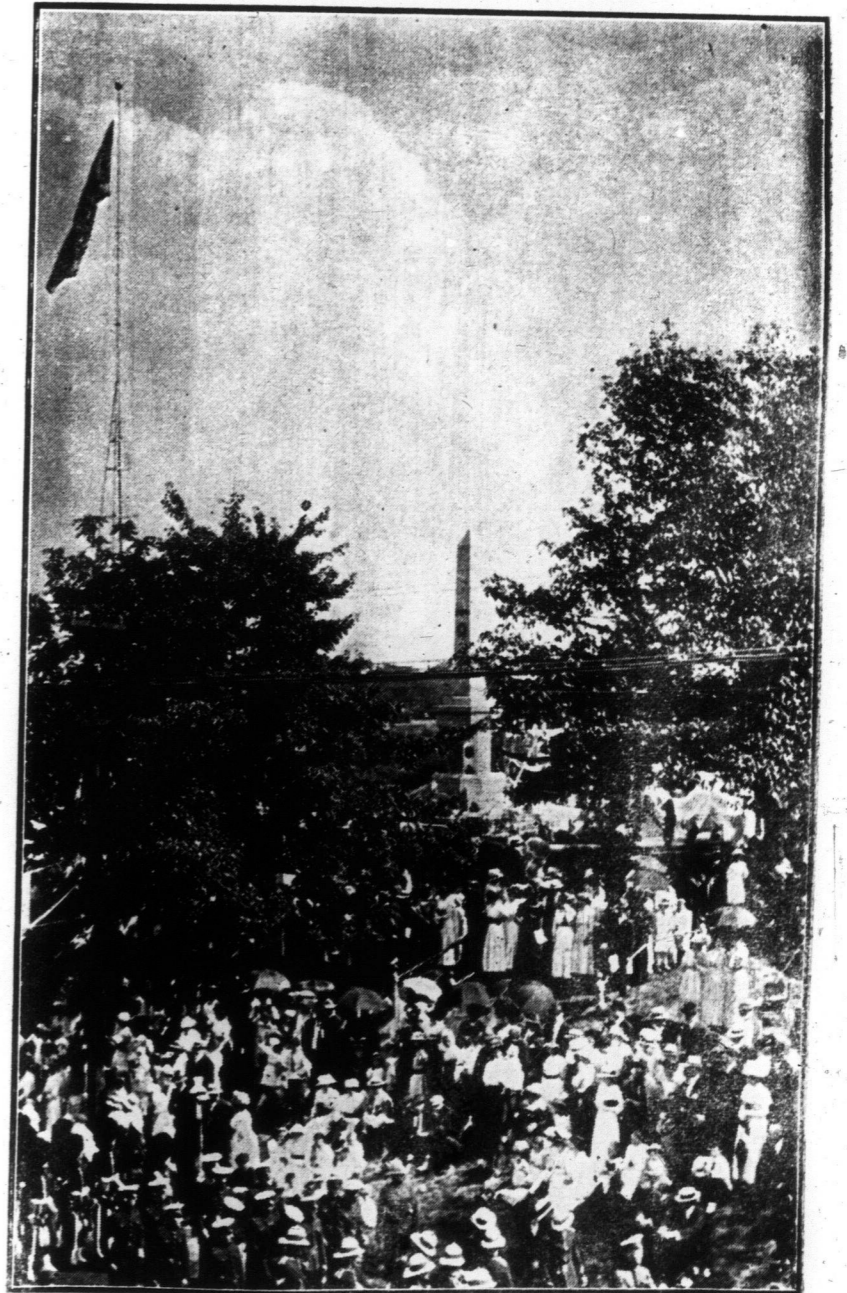
