

R. ADDISON has met a long-felt want in his "Heart of Japan." It was said of Mr. Gale's book on Corea that, brilliant and racy though it was, it was a book of travel and adventure, rather than a book on missions. Mr. Addison's book is distinctly on missionary lines.

In this age, when every magazine Vol. LXI. No. 4. and newspaper has articles on Japan, when things Japanese are becoming as much a part of our education as botany or rhetoric, there is, nevertheless, a danger of our seeing only the material, not the spiritual, side of Japan. There is a tendency to see only fair Japan, with her mountains and her flowers, her silk-clad ladies, her dainty tea-houses, her parks in cherry bloom, the lotus sleeping on her lakes, and the kites flying in the air.
