" latter were equally fo. I do not think " America complains of particular injuries fo " much as she does of the violation of her " rights. The congress sum up the whole " of their grievances in that passage of the " declaratory act which afferts the right of "Great Britain to make laws to bind them " in all cases whatsoever. That is the true " bone of contention. They positively de-" ny the right not the mode of exercifing it. "They would allow the King of Great Bri-" tain a nominal fovereignty over them, but " nothing elfe. They would throw off their " dependence on the crown of Great Britain but not on the person of the King whom " they would render a cypher. They would " be as Hanover is to England." To this state of the controversy you were pleased to add, in favour of hostile measures: "The "Americans are now at war, they have in-" vaded Canada, they are acting on the of-" fensive; we are not to enquire who was the " aggreffor; whether we are right or wrong, "we must proceed.
