WISHMBT LAW.

ABSTRACT of An Act, passed A. D. 1838-entitled "An Act to prevent injuries to the Fisheries within the County of Luneuburg, by

MILL DAMS, OR ANY OTHER OBSTRUCTIONS."

1st. General Sessions to appoint Overseens or Fisheries, each of whom is to be sworn, and to forfeit a fine not less than one pound, and not more than five pounds, for neglect or refusal to serve. General Sessions may pay out of County Itates, such sum, as they may deem necessary for enforcing this Act.

2nd. Each Overseer shall from time to time, and at least three times a year, carefully examine the different Rivers, Streams, Branches of Rivers, Lakes, Mill Pends and Brooks, within his district; and in case any Mill Dam, Erection, Nuisauce, of Obstructions whatever, or any Slabs, Boards, Stones, or other thing injurious to the Fisheries, or by which the Fish cannot freely pass be bo found therein,—the Oversee: shall report the same, on oath in writing, to any Justice of the Peace.

Brd. Any Justice to whom such complaint, or the complaint of any person on eath shall be made, shall notify the same to the Clerk of the Peace, who shall assemble a Grecial Sessions, and give notice thereof to the coviner or occupier, or person offending. Special Sessions shall examine into the complaint, and if they find it are grounded and proved, they shall order the owner, occupier, or offender, to remove the same according to the meaning of this Act, within a reasonable time, and convict him in a Penalty of not less than Theo, nor more Ten pounds for each offence, with Costs.

4th. Such Special Sessions shall and may, if they deem it expedient, also issue a warrant to the Sheriff, directing him with his Assistant to remove or destroy the obstruction or nuisance; and all persons are required to aid him, under a pountly of not less than one pound, and not more than five pounds, for neglecting or refusing so to assist.

5th. Warrant to issue for above Fine and Cests.

6th. Party aggrieved may, on giving Security, appeal to General Sessions.

7th. General Sessions may regulate Fisheries, although the Land on both sides be owned by the same person, and may forbid fishing by dip note or scoops.

COURT OF GENERAL SESSIONS, LUNENBURG,

10th April, 1838.

The Court direct that all obstructions to the River Fisheries be forthwith removed, and that the Overseers of Fisheries differently perform the important duties imposed on them by the above. Act.
