**SURVIVOR OF A FAMOUS MA
SACRE OF MISSIONARIES.**

Puego were murdered in 1859, and the event was recalled in an interesting manner the other day, when Mr. Alfred Cole, of Bristol, Emsland, and his wife arrived at the wedding.

Mr. Cole is the youngest of the missionary massacre in Tierra del Fuego in November, 1859, when eight missionaries from the ship Allen Gardiner, which had sailed from England to take the natives, Mr. Cole was left in charge of the ship while his companions landed, but he was forced to leave the vessel and flee to the interior where he never returned.

The ship was completely stripped of all its movable effects.
