CHURCH PLAYS A LONE HAND

Controller Goes Down to Ottawa Without Warning and Will Be Called to Account On His Return.

Controller Church's anxiety to stir the Borden government up to a sense of Toronto's wrongs has brought considerable trouble upon his own shoulders, and he will be called to account when he returns home.

The controller was "called" to Ottawa from the midst of the fray on Wednesday night, and yesterday morning the mayor was made aware of the fact that he had arrived safely at Ottawa by the receipt of three somewhat lengthy telegrams within an hour, or less, informing him that the whole cabinet was bestirring itself on behalf of Toronto.

The first telegram stated that the controller had obtained an appointment with Colonel the Hon. Sam Hughes, for the purpose of discussing the occupancy of the Garrison Commons and the pavement of the street running beside the armories. This convinced the board of control that it was necessary to put Controller Church back in his place when he returns.

The second telegram was considered a large order by the mayor. It stated that the mayor was to ask to have the corporation counsel draw up a resolution to the City Council with a municipal consent clause requiring the Bell Telephone Co. to secure permission for its street work. Other requests were submitted of equal importance.

The third telegram received stated that 50 municipalities would be represented at the conference and that the controller was trying to get the Toronto members to accompany the city representatives in laying their demands before the government.

Mayor Hocken only saw fit to acknowledge one of his telegrams. He asked the controllers to cancel his appointment with the minister of militia, on account of the exhibition authorities not being able to go down.
