INTERESTING LETTER CASE.

Believille, Nov. 20—Judgment in an interesting case was given by Police Magistrate Flink of this city. Frederick Hewlay of Thurlow was charged with stealing a letter belonging to Mrs. W. S. Spencer of Brockville, who had come to visit him and other friends in Thurlow. Hawley was asked by Mrs. Spencer to ask that the Belleville postofice for a letter for her, which he did, receiving one. 
