Under the constitution of the order, such members receive each year after that age one tenth of the amount of their policy. It ought to be noted also that this order does not collect premiums from any of its members after the 70th birthday. The accumulated funds of this great institution increased during 1903 by over \$4000 for every working day of the year. The position of the institution, therefore, was this, that while it paid out over \$6000 each day. It is even still more important to note that the assets of the order increased in per cent. during the year by a little over four times as much as the obligations or the insurance at risk. The cheques of the I.O.F., counting death claim cheques, disability cheques and sick benefit claims, amount to thousands during the twelve months.
