BORDEN ATTRIBUTES KITCHENER TROUBLE TO ORGANIZED BODY

Work of Four Hundred Roughs and Hoodlums, He Says.

TORONTO, Nov. 25.—Sir Robert Borden attributes the disturbance at the meeting of the audience assembled for his campaign meeting refused to permit either the speaker or an organized effort in a statement given out here this evening. Sir Robert stated that this is the first time in a public career of twenty-one years that he has been refused a hearing at a meeting that he sought to address. His statement is as follows:

"There was a deliberate and successful attempt to break up the meeting at the Borden campaign meeting on Saturday evening. From what has since transpired it is apparent that the arrangements for this purpose were organized several days in advance of the meeting. The disturbance, which prevented Mr. Borden from speaking, was the work of three or four hundred roughs and hoodlums and cannot in anywise be attributed to the respectable people of Borden."

"In 21 years of public life, this is the only occasion on which I have been prevented from speaking to a meeting that I sought to address."

ITALYAN FIRST ARM VICTORY

Austro-German Attacks Are Beaten On Asiago Plateau.

ENEMY'S FORCE WANING

Austrians Meet With Another Defeat In Southern Albania.

ROME, Nov. 25.—(British Admiralty, per Wireless Press).—Troops of the Italian first army on the Asiago plateau yesterday repulsed several serious Austro-German attacks and counter-attacks with success. The Italian war office announced.

The text of the statement reads: "On the Asiago plateau heroic parties of the first army who, for ten days, interrupted and without yielding a yard of ground have been fighting for the defense of the plateau, yesterday again repulsed several serious enemy attacks and counter-attacks with success. Two sections of machine guns were captured."

On the rest of the front there were only artillery actions. "Near Monte Grappa two enemy airplanes were brought down by one of our airmen."

The Austrians have renewed their attacks on the Italian lines in Southern Albania, but met with a repulse at the defenders' hands, the war office announced last night. Some fighting in the Monastir district resulted in unchanged conditions at the close of the operations. The official statement reads:

"In Albania on Thursday night the enemy attacked our lines between the Vovusa and Osum Rivers. He was repulsed. A few local enemy advances gained between Monastir and Presheva were nullified by our counter-attacks."

Saturday's statement announced: "On the mountain front, from Asiago Plateau to the Breno, the enemy stubbornly carried out after heavy artillery preparation, all failed."

"On the plains enemy groups attempting to cross the Piave River in boats were driven into the water by cannon shots."

ITALIANS WIN BACK MOUNTAIN POSITIONS.

ITALIAN HEADQUARTERS IN NORTHERN ITALY, Nov. 24.—(By the Associated Press).—The battle of the mountains is raging with unexampled violence. The Austrians have been driven back from the Asiago plateau. The Italian army has won back the mountain positions. The losses have been very heavy on both sides.

BRITISH ARMY HEADQUARTERS IN FRANCE, Nov. 25.—(By the Associated Press).—The Germans have continued to stiffen their resistance against the British advance and as one British officer remarked "The Boche has been fighting hard."

If the British retain their hold on Bourlon wood and the village they will have acquired position on high ground which overlooks wide reaches of the surrounding territory.

BOMB EXPLODES IN POLICE STATION

Seven Detectives, Two Policemen and One Woman Blown to Pieces.

TIMED TO KILL HUNDREDS

Patriotic Meeting Would Have Been Blown Up Had the Plot Succeeded.

MILWAUKEE, Nov. 25.—Ten persons were killed and several injured last night when a bomb designed to destroy the local Evangelical Church, in the heart of the third ward, an Italian settlement, exploded in central police station, which it had been carried for examination.

Seven detectives, two policemen and one woman were killed. The bomb, evidently with a time fuse attached, was found in the basement of the church.

When a searching party, equipped with fire department lights, entered the squad room, the scene was shocking to even the hardened policemen and firemen who are used to tragic emergencies.

VENICE, Saturday, Nov. 24.—(By the Associated Press).—The sound of the shells at the mouth of the Piave con- tinued to be heard in Venice, but the first fears of the small part of the population remaining have been considerably relieved, as the Italians are strongly re- sisting along the line of the river.

An enemy airplane raid took place Friday, a number of bombs being dropped in the city. The bombs were scattered in the city, but no damage was done.
