



SIR WM. BAPTIE SHOULD BE SHOT, DECLARES SMART

Quebec General and M. L. A. Repeats Charges and Scores White.

MONTREAL, July 7.—Speaking at Victoria Hall, Westmount, tonight, Brigadier-General C. A. Smart, M.L.A., reviewed the speeches of Sir Thomas White and General Newburn that had been made during the debate in the House of Commons at Ottawa on the

Canadian overseas administration and reiterated the charges made by him before the Quebec Legislature last winter. He replied to what he called the "Mean insinuations" made in these speeches and at one point gave the lie direct to General Newburn.

Speaking of Sir William Baptie, who had presided over the commission that had sat on the findings of the Bruce commission, General Smart stated that only the social position of Sir William Baptie, his political pull and his Victoria Cross had saved him from a court martial, and added that Sir William should have been shot.

Acting in Bad Faith. He claimed that Sir Thomas White must have been in bad faith in not touching on the British Government's blue book on the Mesopotamia report, since he must have access to it, in looking up Sir William Baptie's record. General Smart made strong attacks upon Sir George Perley, Sir William Turner, General Foster, Sir Edward Kemp and Premier Borden. He urged that a royal commission or an inquiry into the overseas administration be constituted at the earliest moment and reiterated his statement that Sir Arthur Currie had been intrigued against.

\$700,000,000 VOTED TO GOVT. THIS SESSION

Senator Bostock Cites Huge Expenditures on Supply Vote.

POWER BILL IS KILLED

The Champions of Municipal Rights Must Go Unappealed.

OTTAWA, July 7.—A supply bill of \$700,000,000 was voted by the Senate this morning. Commons' rejection of Senate amendments to the sexual offences bill was read and the Government bill respecting electric and power companies was ruled out of order.

The effect of these actions is that the Government gets all the money it has asked Parliament for this session, which Senator Bostock said was over seven hundred millions.

Age Limit the Same. The age of consent remains at sixteen years. The Commons bill proposed to increase the age to eighteen in all cases where the girl had been previously virtuous and the man was over eighteen, and in the case of employer and employee to the age of 21. The amendment of the Senate, which was that where the man was not wholly or chiefly to blame for the offence, the judge might instruct the jury that a verdict to acquit could be found. The answer of the Commons to this amendment was that the question of "comparative culpability" of the persons concerned cannot be considered.

The non-concurrence of the Commons with the Senate on this point has the effect of killing the whole bill for this session and leaving the age of consent as fixed by the criminal code at sixteen years.

Power Bill Killed. The Reid power bill, by which it was designed to give legislative force to that clause of the consolidated railway act which was so amended by the Senate as to be unacceptable to the champions of municipal rights, was declared out of order by Speaker Borden. The bill passed the Commons last week and the Senate this morning. Mr. Speaker declared that the subject matter of the bill having been discussed and voted on during consideration of the railway act, it could not be brought up again during the present session. Speaker's ruling was not questioned by anyone, and so the bill is dead.

PERTH ALLIANCE CALLS HEARST'S ELECTION DODGE

Forestalls His Move To Slip In on the Prohibition Referendum.

ELGIN ELECTION SIGNS

Macdiarmid, Fearing Outcome, Starts In on Hand-Shaking Campaign.

[Special to The Advertiser.] STRATFORD, July 7.—Plans for the part which temperance workers of Perth County will take in the forthcoming temperance referendum were discussed at the annual meeting of the Perth Temperance Alliance here today. The attendance was large. T. L. Hamilton of Listowel presided.

The resolutions adopted were as follows: "In view of the fact that certain press reports have brought to our notice the possibility of a provincial political campaign being brought on the same time as the prohibition referendum, we, as the provincial alliance of Perth County, would earnestly urge on the Government the importance of the prohibition vote being kept free from any political issue."

Appreciation of the action of the Government in extending the franchise to the women was expressed.

The financial report showed the association in a strong financial position. The officers elected were: President, T. L. Hamilton, Listowel; first vice-president, Dr. Coupland, St. Marys; second vice-president, Mrs. Edgcombe, Stratford; third vice-president, Hugh Richmond, Elma; treasurer, S. L. Adolph, Listowel.

HAND-GRABBING DRIVE.

THOMAS, July 7.—Judging by present indications the election campaign of the Tory party for the Provincial House has already opened, at least in the riding of West Elgin. Hon. F. C. Macdiarmid, M.P., for the west riding, since his arrival a few days ago, has spent most of his time—in fact almost all of it—in extending the "glad hand" to all those who were once his supporters. He has spent several hours since his visit here at the local golf course. Other spare moments he has been "investigating" conditions among the farmers in the west riding.

On Saturday he spent some time with the leading supporters of the Tory party here, and it is rumored tonight that he may be listed among the speakers for the Knights of Pythias' festivities tomorrow or Wednesday.

The candidate for the Legislature who will lead the Liberals of the west riding of Elgin has not yet been chosen, but from reports received from various sources everything at the present time points to "rough going" for the Tory candidate. In East Elgin matters are much the same, but victory for the Liberal candidate, Wilson H. Mills, is doubly sure in that end of the county. Many East Elgin residents have during the past two years more questioned the Tory party. "Who is the Tory member for that riding?" His name is Andrew W. Brown, and he has been in the riding since he announced that he is again to contest the riding. Judging by information received from this district there is little doubt as to the outcome.

FOUR WINNIPEG STRIKE LEADERS WILL COME HERE

Seeking Funds in Eastern Canada To Defend Their Trial.

TORONTO, July 7.—Four of the most prominent leaders in the recent Winnipeg strike arrived in Toronto at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon. The party consisted of Ald. Queen and A. A. Heaps, R. E. Bray and T. H. Duane, the latter two being returned soldiers. The four who are out on bail, say they will inaugurate a crusade on behalf of the five men now under arrest in Winnipeg, to secure for them a trial by jury.

When interviewed immediately following their arrival, Ald. Heaps said: "We arrived from Winnipeg to put before the people of Toronto the true position of the men who are in Winnipeg during the strike and as they now exist. We are demanding for the men now held under the time-honored act a fair trial by jury. While here, we will solicit funds to carry on the defence of all the accused."

To Tour the East. Ald. Queen stated they would tour all Eastern Canada, the first point on their itinerary after Toronto being Hamilton, from whence they will proceed to London. "It is our intention," said Ald. Queen, "to circulate a monster petition on behalf of the men now detained under the immigration act."

"Conditions in Winnipeg and throughout the West," said R. E. Bray, "are very unsettled, and I may say that they will never settle down until the men who are in Winnipeg are released. The bitter discrimination being manifested by the employers. There are at least fifty of us who are permanently blacklisted and cannot secure employment in Winnipeg for love or money. In fact it is doubtful if we could secure work anywhere once our names are mentioned. I don't think any of the West will ever settle down again to its former condition. In Calgary they had at least seven exciting times during the strike, although theirs was of shorter duration. There were several clashes between the cowboys and the R. N. W. M. Police, in which the latter were roughly handled."

All four were immediately rushed from the station to the labor temple, where they are staying. A meeting of the machinists which was in session at the time of their arrival. Arrangements are being made by H. L. Lewis, editor of the Ontario Labor News, to secure a permit to hold a mass meeting in Queen's Park tomorrow evening. In addition to any open air meeting that may be arranged, the visitors will be asked to speak at the various meetings at the labor temple.

The reception committee which met the Winnipeg men consisted of R. C. Brown, John Munro, president of the machinists' union; H. Lewis, John Macdonald, Jan, organizer of the A. S. of E., James Lowe and W. Queen, a brother of the visiting alderman.

The visitors said that they presence here had been permitted by special arrangement made with the authorities, who were not ready to proceed with the men's cases yet. Immediately the prosecution will have completed its case, the four men will be recalled to stand their trial.

MINING BOSS KILLED; WALKS INTO A BLAST

COBALT, July 7.—S. A. McDonald, a married man, who lived at Cobalt, was instantly killed in a blasting accident at the Foster Mine at Kerr Lake, three miles from here, this afternoon. McDonald, who was shift boss at the property, walked into a blast in a stoop.
