Hints for the Cook

Cranberry Sauce Four cups of cranberries, washed and put in granite pan; pour over two cups of sugar and one cup of water.

Stuffed Figs Let whole dried figs stand in grape juice for several hours until soft but not soggy.

Pumpkin Pie One and one-half cups mashed pumpkin, one heaping tablespoon sugar, 1 tablespoon molasses, 1/2 cup common cracker rolled fine.

Delicious Fruit Cake Two cups sugar, 1 cup molasses, 1 cup butter, 4 cups flour, 1 teaspoon soda, 2 teaspoons cream of tartar.

Chocolate Cake One cup sugar, half cup cocoa, half cup butter, yolks of three eggs, teaspoonful of vanilla.

Canadian Plum Pudding Two sieves of flour sifted three times, two quarts breadcrumbs, one pound suet, one pound raisins, one pound currants.
