AARON D. COLWELL DIES AT MARTINON

Aaron D. Colwell, sixty-two years old, died suddenly at his summer home, at Martinon, last evening. He had been ill for several months with heart trouble. He had been confined to his bed for ten days, but his recovery had been expected.

Mr. Colwell was one of the best known printers in New Brunswick. He was employed with Barnes & Co. until two weeks ago. He had worked with this firm for six years. Previously he was engaged as a printer with the *Harvard Observer*.

During his work in St. John Mr. Colwell was engaged as foreman with the Gazette, under the management of John Bowes. In later years he was editor of the *Union Worker*, which position he held for two years. He also was secretary-treasurer of the Trades and Labor Council.

Mr. Colwell is survived by his widow, three sons and two daughters. The sons are Walter, of Pokok; Arthur, of West St. John, and Harry, St. John. The daughters are Mrs. W. McLennan, St. John, and Mrs. Chester Whitaker, St. John.

B., and is survived by four brothers and six sisters residing in different parts of the United States and Canada. Mr. Gallagher was a gardener and for several years followed up that occupation in New York State. James L. Mrs. Sarah Wannamaker.

The home and lands were inherited by James H. Manchester, who was a scientific farmer, having been educated at the Ontario Agricultural College at Guelph. He gave evidence of his successful training in the operation of the King's county observation farm, which standard he had won for his fine meadows and uplands. In the death of Mr. Manchester, King's county and particularly this section, has lost a prominent citizen and a gentleman of high ideals whose counsel was often sought and freely given. 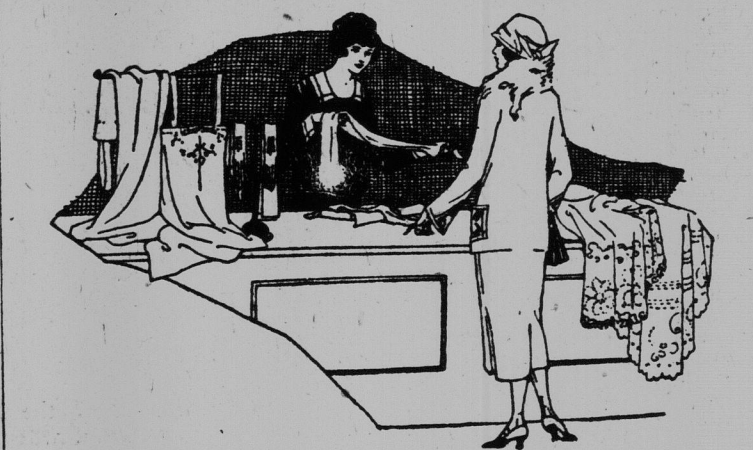
Mrs. David Twigg.

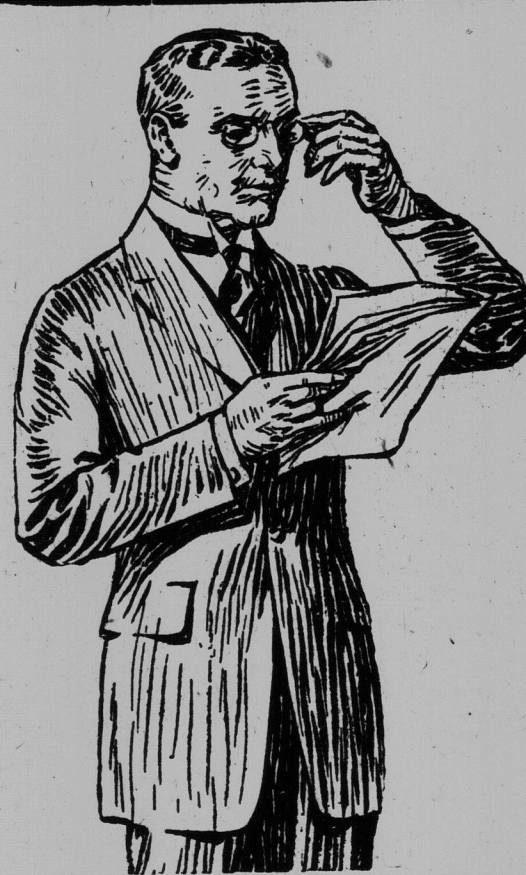

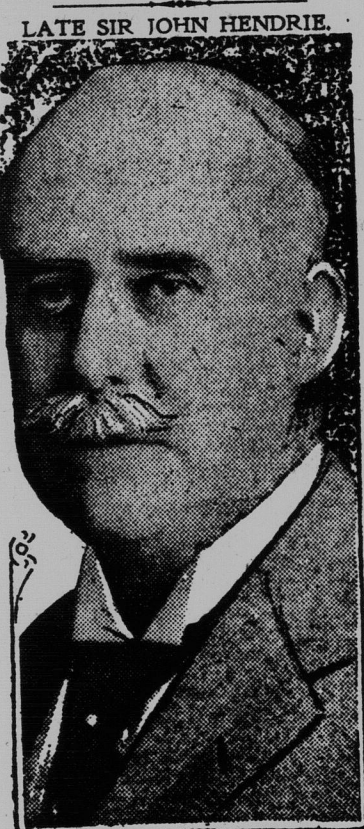

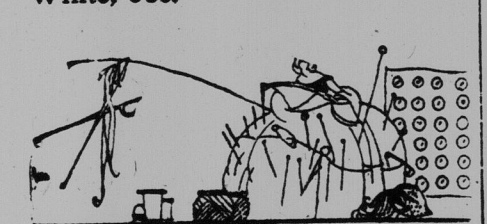
