## OBJECTS TO HAYS AS HEAD OF FILMS

Harrison "Suspicious" of the Motion Picture Industry's Offer to Postmaster General—Sees Politics in the Move.

Washington, Jan. 11.—The reported acceptance by Postmaster General Will H. Hays of an offer to become the head of the proposed National Moving Picture organization came up in the Senate when Senator Harrison of Mississippi arraigned the industry for going into the Cabinet of the President for a directing official and expressed his curiosity as to what the move by those who controlled the industry might really mean. He suggested that the motion-picture men might have taken into consideration the fact that Mr. Hays was close to the president, and also an able politician when they selected him up to the present time, and, so far as I know, it has not sought to influence elections. However, we don't think he is true or not, we have heard with deep regret that a great Republican leader has been made an offer to become, at an enormous salary, the head of the entire motion-picture industry. According to the reports, he is to become their "business and policy" director at a salary of \$100,000 or \$150,000 a year.

"Why has Mr. Hays been selected for this position? What is the purpose of the offer? Is it due to the fact that Mr. Hays is close to the powers that be? Is it because he today controls the mails? Is it because he has the ear of the president and is a member of the president's own cabinet circle? Is it because, as chairman of the Republican National Committee, he elected three years ago a Republican Congress? Is it because he played a prominent part in selecting the senators who are now leading the majority in this chamber? Predicts He Will Accept.

"Is he going to accept? Why, of course he is going to accept, and they are not paying him this great salary to be a star along with 'Doug' Fairbanks, Mary Pickford and 'Fatty' Arbuckle and other lights of the screen. They did it because they think that he can do the work. He was not selected to elevate the morals of the industry.

"There is more significance in the offering of this position to the Postmaster General than there would be in the case the offer was made to any other cabinet officer. Mr. Hays is a politician of the cabinet. He is a political organizer of ability and energy and has been the head of the Republican National Committee. He elected the Republican Senate and House, and there are many questions of importance to the moving picture industry coming up in Congress.

"There is at this time a question before the Finance Committee, the placing of a tariff on foreign motion-picture films. Do the moving picture men think that because of Mr. Hays' closeness to the president he can work wonders in that new tariff bill that is yet to come, or in the supplementary tax bill that runner says is going to replace the tax bill that was enacted recently?"
