TO PROVIDE FOR COTTAGE HOSPITALS

Requests from Kent and Charlotte counties for the establishment of cottage hospitals in these counties by the Red Cross Society, in accordance with its peace-time policy were considered at a meeting of the cottage hospital committee of the society, presided over by the convener, Mrs. H. Lawrence, and held in the Church of England Institute. It was decided to establish a hospital at St. George, in Charlotte county, if certain conditions regarding its support were complied with. The establishment of a hospital in Kent county was left for later consideration. The cottage hospitals, as proposed, will share from three to five beds and be used as emergency hospitals. As it was felt that central organization for the cottage hospital committee was essential, it was decided that the committee would be composed of twenty members, including the minister of health, members of the Victorian Order of Nurses, the presidents of local

branches and other Red Cross members. Miss Ethel Jarvis was appointed secretary and Mrs. Ferguson of Moncton, was appointed convener of a sub-committee to draft a constitution.

There were about thirty girls present and the evening's programme which consisted of games of many kinds, followed by the serving of refreshments was most thoroughly enjoyed. Miss Sellers, the dietician, assisted with the serving of the refreshments. It was hoped that the gathering might be the first of many during the coming winter.

DECISION GIVEN IN LUMBER SUIT

The case of C. H. Hayes, of Head of Millstream, Kings county, against H. C. Hens and Carl Duffy, composing the Coal Creek Lumber Company of Chipman, Queens county, which was commenced on Thursday last in the Kings county circuit court at Hampton before Chief Justice McKeown and a jury, was concluded last evening. The plaintiff's claim was for \$7,540, the balance alleged to be due for the price of logs sold by the plaintiff to the defendants, in April, 1919. The defendants had paid \$2,500 on account and tendered \$2,100 in full settlement of the balance due, which amount the plaintiff refused to accept and brought this action. The jury, after being out three hours, found a balance due the plaintiff of \$4,040.95. On motion of counsel for the defendants, his honor deferred the entering of a verdict until the end of this session of the court, and adjournment was made until September 22. E. C. Weyman of Innes, Weyman & Hazen, for the plaintiff; R. St. J. Freeze and K. A. Wilson for the defendants.
