

River Towboat Was Just About Ready to Begin Season's Work

The towboat Hero, belonging to the St. John River Log Driving Company, sank at its winter berth, Marble Cove, Indiantown, last night and at present lies almost completely submerged, only the tops of the paddle boxes and funnels showing above water.

It is an annoying coincidence that the boat was to be put in commission today or tomorrow, having been coaled up and otherwise made ready. In fact just at this juncture the need of towing craft is becoming urgent as mills have commenced to saw and a steady supply of logs is required.

The Hero is one of the old Glasier fleet of river boats and a familiar one to many. It is about thirty years of age but still able to do a good job at towing. Captain Garrity, who lives above Fredericton, is to command the Hero as he has done for some seasons. He is expected to arrive today or tomorrow.

The sunken tug will probably be buoyed up with scows and floated to a beach either in the pulp mill cove at the Falls or in Market slip and there drained and made ready again for service. It is not thought that it is seriously damaged, if at all. The accident is thought to have occurred through the opening of one of the cocks.


