## AL DEPENDING UPON ONE PLAYER

Collins Trade Blocked by Refusal of White Sox to Give Blankinsop to Yanks—Everything Else Ready for Exchange.

New York, Dec. 22.—The celebrated long-awaited deal between the Yanks and White Sox hangs on the action of one player, according to Bill Huggins, who left for his home Cincinnati recently and reviewed the market as he waited for train to approach. The Yanks, he declared, have agreed on the three athletes whom they are willing to ship to Chicago, but the Sox balk at handing over a certain pitcher, and that little quality represents the insect in the team.

Huggins admitted that Kid Gleason as consented to part with Eddie Col-

lins and Left Fielder Bill Falk, the young Texan. It is known on equally good authority that the Yanks who will go—if there is a trade—are Bob Meusel and Aaron Ward. But the Sox demand a pitcher, Walter Hoyt, and Huggins balks at this sacrifice of the Brooklyn boy unless he gets a certain twirler in return.

"You'll have to guess at the identity of this Chicago pitcher," said Huggins. "I've already told you about Collins and Falk. The White Sox also want a pitcher—moreover, a pitcher whom I can't let go without getting another to take his place."

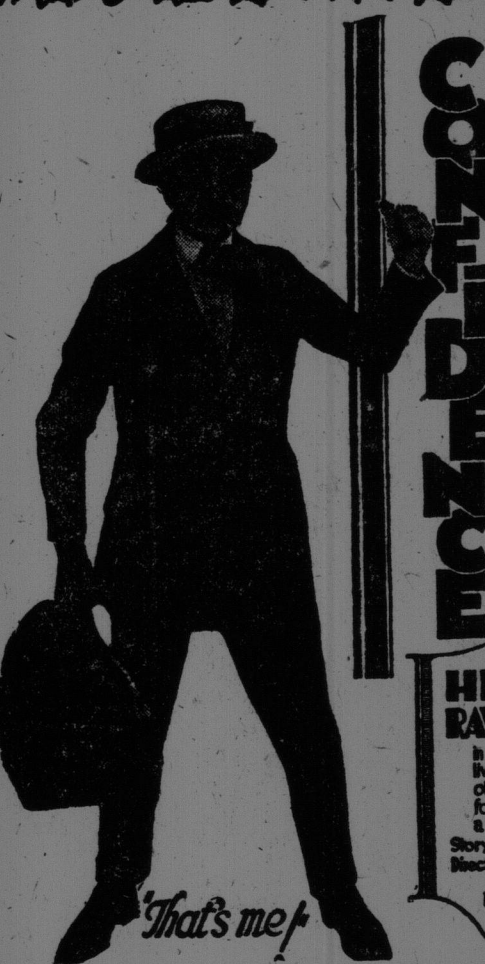
