
John McGraw told reporters that the era of high prices for minor league players is nearing an end. The Little Napoleon did not say that he would not go high for a player if he had to he made no promise as binding as this — but he stated as his opinion that the days of \$100,000 and \$75,000 for starperformers are about over.

Part of this opinion is based on the recent decision of the majors to boycott the minors unless players sold or released to the latter are subject of draft at all future times. One effect of this will be to increase greatly the number of players in the minor leagues on which the majors have this right of recal. With each club putting out fifteen athletes a year, it will be only a question of time before the punch will be taken out of the draft opposition.

"And there won't be any war over the question, either," said McGraw. 'Without the majors the minors would be powerless. In case of war the big 'ellows would merely step in and sign ill the star players. Anyway, the draft loes not prevent a minor league club 'rom selling a payer at as high a price is possible. If he is in demand, the

loes not prevent a minor league club chestern and more than one critic before me selling a piayer at as high a price is spossible.
