HARDWARE MARKETS

(Hardware and Metal.)

A sharp advance in turpentine is recorded this week, amounting to twelve cents per gallon. This may be termed one of the first lines to reflect conditions which have followed signing of armistice and is in line with situation as outlined in Vandance and Matal during the next.

There is no indication that the peak has yet been reached. Government reports from the United States show production for the past season is no more 104% than required for United States needs. It is further pointed out that next year's production will not be any larger than for the past season. With the heavy demands to be met from overseas, it is not hard to determine how prices will go. It is also true that users face a situation which may develop into one of decided seriousness, due to shortage which may arise.

The steel oil is another line which has undergone revision upward. Advances of four to five cents have been registered, and indications point to even higher levels as well within the realm of possibility. Prices on seed have been recovering from recent depression during the past two weeks, and since Monday of this week sharp advances have been made. This may be a speculative flurry, but feeling is general that from now

made. This may be a speculative flurry, but feeling is general that from now until close of navigation seed will continue high.

Another line of horse nails is included in the list to go to higher levels, prices today being up just one cent per pound over former figures. Lace leather has gone higher, prices today being up about twenty-five cents per pound over previous quotations. The steady decline in available supplies of all leathers is a factor extending to this class of goods and resulting in increased prices.

Other lines included in the list to follow the upward trend this week are school crayons, carpenters' chalk, post drills, blowers, forges, mouse and rat traps, charcoal and wheelbarrows. An advance of about 5 per cent. is reported also in stocks and dies, screw plates, pipe taps, hand taps, reamers, etc., immediately effective. Vises, hand soap, mauls, and gimlet bits have also gone to higher levels.

The trade as a whole looks forward to a period of marked prosperity for Canada. No reason for depression is expressed over the approach of peace, rather is the feeling in evidenc that having

No reason for depression is expressed over the approach of peace, rather is the feeling in evidenc that having faced four years of war, in which many dark days were strewn, prosperity should now come, and every effort to keep conditions bright exerted. No immediate recession in values is looked for. Stocks are low and replacement is impossible for some time to come with the majority of lines. This will probably mean a steadily maintained basis of quotations.
