THE DEADLY TORNADO.

IT SWEEPS OVER ILLINOIS DESTROYING EVERYTHING IN ITS PATH.

Many Lives are Lost and Serious Damage to Property Reported.—The storm also visited Minnesota and followed by Disastrous Rain.

By TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. MINNAPOLIS, Ill., June 21.—The tornado that swept over the country about nine miles from here yesterday afternoon did great damage. It travelled about ten miles and heaved on a path about half a mile wide. Ten houses were blown late atoms. At Scholton ten lives are reported lost and one hundred people injured. A school house, north of and everything about it, was blown down and all were found buried and bleeding in the debris. Many farm houses were demolished about West Scholton. But more particulars are obtainable.

CHICAGO, Ill., June 21.—A tornado struck this section about 4 yesterday afternoon. A school house was destroyed and completely wiped out. The storm passed on in a north-easterly direction sweeping houses and everything about it, and killing eight persons. Bridges are gone, the roads are impassable and the means of communication are difficult.

DIXON, Ill., June 21.—A cyclone struck the town of Pax yesterday afternoon and completely wiped it out. Twenty persons were killed and a great many injured.
