m Popley Ottawa, 26th January, 1912. Sir, I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your favour of the 19th instant, with respect to the murder of Adam John. I note that the coroners jury returned a verdict of murder against Steven Kiyeshk, an Indian, who was given a hearing before Police Magistrate Boothman and has been .. committed for trial at Sarnia. I note also that the body of Charles Mah dee has not been recovered yet, and you suggest the offering of a higher reward than the \$10.00 spoken of in your former letter. In reply I beg to say that the Department desires you to ascertain the date of the trial of Kiyoshk, and whether this Indian has funds at his disposal for his own defence.
