Report of the Survey of the Hudson's Bay Company
reservations at the Fairford Indian Mission, Province
of Manitoba.

Sir:

Through the courtesy of Mr. C. E. Chipman of the Hudson's
Bay Company, I was enabled to obtain a description of the Com-
pany's Reserve at Fairford, which is as follows:

"All and singular that parcel or tract of land sit-
uate lying and being in the Province of Manitoba,
in Our Dominion of Canada, and being composed of
the Reserve at Fairford Mission, and being more par-
ticularly described as follows, that is to say:
commencing at a poplar post marked H.B. planted in
the most southerly bank of the Fairford River at the
North East angle of the reserve hereby described thence
due south fifty three chains and ninety-two links to
a poplar postmarked H.B.--thence due west twenty
chains to a poplar post marked H.B.--thence due north
six chains and ten links to a poplar post marked H.B.
planted in the most southerly bank of the Fairford
River--thence in a northerly direction following the
said bank of the said river to the place of beginning,
containing by admeasurement one hundred acres, more
or less, and being the block of land surveyed and
set out adjoining the post or station of the Company,
known as Fairford Mission."

This original survey was made prior to the survey
of either I.R. 50 or of the settlement Lots shown in
plan of the same dated 27th of October, 1912.

This latter plan shows a cut off of part of the
E. P. of the H. B. Co's reserve at the North end
