CANADIAN SHIPPING INCREASE. The last Blue Book issued by the Department of Marine and Fisheries shows the number of vessels registered in the Dominion to be 7,994, with a tonnage of 759,929 (including lake and coastwise tonnage)—an increase of 136 in the number of vessels and of 23,373 in the tonnage registered in Canadian ports as compared with those recorded in the Blue Book of the previous year.
