DAMAGED BY ICE.
Baltimore, Feb. 28.—Str. Belfast here yesterday, had some plates damaged by ice when off the Grand Banks.

RECENT CHARTERS.
The tern schooner Howell Leeds, has been chartered for a series of lumber cargoes from Lunenburg and Bridgewater, N. S., at private terms.

ARRIVED WITH TIES.
The steamer Oesaba arrived at Portland Saturday from New Orleans with about 50,000 railroad ties for the Grand Trunk, being the last of the lot ordered by the railroad company, the total being 170,000 ties.

The steamer Manchester Exchange sailed from Manchester on Saturday at noon for St. John.

SALT CHARTER.
The first salt charter of the year announced at Portland, the Lord Brothers having engaged the Italian bark King Malcolm, 1233 tons register, which is expected to leave Transant on April 1 for Portland, being due to arrive here early in June. Her cargo consists of about 1,800 tons of salt.

NEW OIL TANK.
The new oil tank steamer Euphon arrived in New York Saturday on her maiden voyage from Sunderland, she was built at Alton, near Dundee, and is of 3,575 tons gross, 2,201 tons register. The vessel is fitted with all the latest appliances, and is an up-to-date oil carrying steamer. She has a capacity of 4,500 tons dead weight.

EASTERN STEAMSHIP LINE.
