Volunteers Swooped Down on Police Station, Slaughtering Small Police Force. Lucknow, India, April 20—(Special) One of the British officials stationed here gives the following version of the sanguinary outbreak at Chauri Chaura

Chauri Chaura is a police station in the district of Gorakhpur, United Provinces, in pursuance of the Gandhi non-cooperation policy of boycotts, bands of men were gathered round the village market

On the date of the tragedy (Feb. 4) a large number of volunteers, followed by thousands of ignorant and credulous villagers, came in a procession and made a demonstration before the police station
