



The goals of the Quilt are to illustrate the impact and human toll of AIDS, to provide a positive and creative means of expression for those whose lives have been touched by the epidemic, and to raise vital funds and encourage support for people with AIDS and their loved ones.

The Names Quilt is an ongoing memorial which continues to grow as panels are added and the epidemic continues. By October of 1989 the Quilt was larger than eight football fields and contained over 8,200 individual panels. The Canadian section of the Quilt, presently consisting of 242 panels, will be displayed in Fredericton from April 5 to April 8, 1990.
