**ATTENTION: First and Second Year  
Students Interested in Teaching?**

Are you kidding? There aren't going to be any jobs, are there? They're laying off teachers in North York and Etobicoke.

But, just one minute. Returns from a recent survey of last year's graduates of York University's Faculty of Education showed that 55 per cent obtained full-time teaching positions, 24 per cent are teaching part-time, 14 per cent have taken non-teaching jobs in such fields as management, art direction, and career counselling, while 7 per cent have made other plans such as parenthood, travelling and further education.


**Spring Dance Concert**
