I know perhaps as well or better than the author of the letter enclosed that financial concerns are organized, but the only method of overcoming their domination appears to me as indicated by this Easter Prayer.

I have taken the burden of copying my name from your shoulders by redacting the Prayer as a complimentary copy.

May you long be spared to promote conservation of Canada's resources for Canadians, and at least a meagre portion forwarded to Britain.
