Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th instant, No. 21, in regard to application of Mr. Miller, District Inspector of Forest Reserves, for a small tract of land at Morley Station on the Stony Reserve, and in reply to say that this land could only be leased after surrender by the Indians, in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Act.

You will be good enough to obtain a description by metes and bounds, of the land applied for, and advise as to the rental which would be satisfactory to the Indians, and the term of lease, upon receipt of which, the question of submitting a Surrender to the Indians, will be given due consideration.
