
Ottawa, 10th November, 1913-

Sir,

Referring to your Requisition for October last, in which you asked for Patent for Lot 10, Con. I, W. B. R. Albemarle, I have to refer you to letter to you of the 19th September last, File 431 933, instructing you to sell this Lot, subject to the usual conditions as to occupation and improvement. The Sale has been accordingly entered from your Land Return for October last. In your letter of the 3rd Instant, however, you state that the fire has burnt all the timber from the Lot, and that it is mostly rock, and recommend that the purchaser be granted Patent unconditionally. Under the circumstances you will be good enough to make a special examination of the Lot, and furnish the Department with a full report of the same, under Statutory Declaration, shewing whether the land or any portion thereof is fit for cultivation, and whether there is any timber upon the Lot, and if so, to what extent. Upon receipt of such a report, the Department will give the matter due consideration.
