



Ottawa, 23rd June 1917.

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 18th instant and will await your further report after your visit to the boundary between the Caughnawaga Indian reserve and the Chateaugay lands. I have however to say that you should use every possible endeavour to induce the white owners of the adjacent lands to agree to pay half the cost of the proposed line fence. If the said white owners are agreed to the line as indicated by P.J. Delisle, no survey will be necessary. The fence should not be built until the said parties are agreed on the location of the said line.
