In Canada, we are happily free from many of the fears which in other lands circumscribe security and freedom. We have freedom of speech and of the press; we have religious freedom; we have freedom of assembly; we have freedom from arbitrary arrest and imprisonment; we are free to choose and change our governments. We did not always have these freedoms.

Until these fears are removed, complete freedom will not have been achieved.
