

The King has approved of the appointment of the Rev. H. C. Beeching, D. Litt., to be Dean of Norwich, in succession to the Bishop Designate of Birmingham. Canon Beeching has been Canon of Westminster Abbey since 1902; he has also been Preacher to the Society of Lincoln's-inn since 1904, and Examining Chaplain to the Bishop of Carlisle since 1905. He was born in 1859, and was educated at the City of London School and Balliol College, Oxford, of which he was a Classical Exhibitioner, graduating in 1883. In 1882 he was ordained to the curacy of Mossley Hill, Liverpool, and from 1885 to 1900 he was Rector of Yattendon, Berks. In 1900 he was Clark Lecturer at Trinity College, Cambridge, and from 1900 to 1903 Professor of Pastoral Theology at King's College, London. In these last three years he was also Chaplain of Lincoln's-inn, and, as stated, became Preacher in 1904, and Canon of Westminster in 1902. He won a prize for the Oxford Sacred Poem in 1806. He is the author of a number of publications.
