A NY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old.

may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskathewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any igency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Dutles—Six months' residence upon and militration of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within the miles of his homestead on a farm of it least 50 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by Lis father, mother, son, laughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Dutles—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent), and cultivate 30 acres extra.


