SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

LINER LOST EN ROUTE TO NEW ORLEANS

United Fruit Company's Boat Received Mysterious Notices of Ransom.

New Orleans, Nov. 26.—The liner Marowijne, en route from Belize, British Honduras, to New Orleans, was lost with 95 persons aboard. Anonymous letters received by the United Fruit Company declared Capt. McLaurin and several passengers were being held for ransom on an island near Yucatan, and that as proof of the assertion, the ship's papers and several other articles were being sent to New York. None of them was ever received. The corporation later offered through newspaper advertisements to pay the ransom demanded, but received no reply. The United Fruit Company, admitting the loss of the vessel, recently paid the families of the members of the Marowijne's crew the salaries due them and one month's salary in addition.

Presented With Gift in Honor of Her Approaching Marriage.

Premier Remarked How Friends and Enemies Had Changed Places.

New York, Nov. 25.—A LONDON cable to The Tribune says—The human side of the House of Commons stood out yesterday, at a little ceremony in the Library of the House. The speaker in behalf of the members of parliament of all parties, presented a wedding gift to Violet Asquith, who will be married next Tuesday to Bonham Carter, her father's secretary and right hand man. The present consisted of a gold ink stand and a diamond brooch.

Miss Asquith seemed quite recovered from her recent illness, which caused the postponement of the wedding, and made a pretty acknowledgment.

Her father, adding his thanks, pointed out that times had changed since the period of heated political feuds, when he first became a time minister.

Former opponents, he said, were now sitting at his side, while the small voice of very candid criticism arose mainly from old friends.

CHINESE AGENT IN PITTSBURGH TO BUY RAILS

American Companies to Get in on Trade Hitherto Held by Europeans.

Pittsburgh, Nov. 26.—C. T. Hsia, an engineer of the Chinese Ministry of communications, arrived in Pittsburgh last night and spent to-day in consultation with manufacturers of steel rails and other railroad supplies and equipment. He explained that the Chinese Government contemplates the construction of 4,000 miles of railroad, and he has been commissioned to investigate American standards with a view to placing orders in this country. Heretofore, railroad construction in China has been under the direction of European engineers, who have inaugurated European methods.

This has resulted in the adoption of European equipment. The war makes such purchases now so difficult that the Chinese Government turned to this country.

GREAT MASS OF EVIDENCE

Attorneys in Buez Prosecution Say Much More Still to be Put In.

Jurors Were Watched Over Thanksgiving Holiday, Also the Witnesses.

New York, Nov. 26.—Only a few of sixteen or seventeen vessels which left Atlantic and Pacific ports early in the war with supplies for German cruisers had figured in the government's evidence when the trial of Karl Buez and other officers and employees of the Hamburg-American line charged with conspiracy to defraud the United States in filing false manifests of these supply ships was resumed to-day. Attorneys for the prosecution said they still had a great mass of evidence.

Most of the testimony has dealt with shipments made from Atlantic ports, but the assistant district attorney has promised to show that the alleged conspiracy extended to San Francisco. During the Thanksgiving recess of the Federal court, agents of the district attorney's office and of the department of justice continued their investigation of the jurors and maintained surveillance over witnesses, who, it was feared, might leave the jurisdiction of the court.
