Apply to the Dominion Lands Agency at Sub-Agency for quarter-section of available Dominion lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Apply to the District. Entry by proxy may be made by any Dominion Land Agent (not a Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Distric—Six months residence in each of three years after settling homestead set out; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Free homestead may be obtained on a quarter-section patent, on certain conditions.

Distric—Six months residence upon one acre of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of the land in the vicinity. A habitable house is required except where residence is in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader is free to lease any acreage of a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre.

A settler who has exhausted his home stead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$10.00 per acre. Distric—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$20.

The area of cultivation is subject to re-lease by the settler at any time. The land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under the provisions of the act.
