Canada Recruits up to March 15 Total 279,242

Ottawa, March 21—Recruiting throughout Canada is keeping up at a rate that is most satisfactory. Up to Mar. 15, 279,242 men had been enrolled. By divisions the enlistments are as follows:

- No. 1, London, 23,651
- No. 2, Toronto, 64,054
- No. 3, Kingston-Ottawa, 29,865
- No. 4, Montreal, 23,697
- No. 5, Quebec, 5,396
- No. 6, Maritime Provinces, 26,324
- No. 10, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, 59,583
- No. 11, British Columbia, 25,771
- No. 13, Alberta, 25,871

It is evident from the figures that Ontario easily leads the list. Divisions in this Province have raised 117,570 men. Quebec has given 29,093, the Maritime Provinces, 26,324, and the Western Provinces as above indicated. Ontario recruiting lately is really better than indicated in the above figures, as Division No. 10, nominally Manitoba and Saskatchewan, really comes as far east as Fort William, Ontario, and several regiments enlisted in that section are credited to Manitoba.

An Object Lesson

New York Press:—Imagine, when it takes a week or so to get part of the military force of the United States—a great deal of it right on the spot—into motion after a horse thief—imagine, we urge upon you, the American people, what it would take to get ready to meet a Japanese or a German swooping down upon us! It was scarcely more than a month after the outbreak of the war in Europe when the German legions, after rushing to their frontiers, sweeping through Belgium and storming across Northern France, were thundering at the gates of Paris. They had razed many cities and demolished great forts. They had crossed rivers, scaled mountains and traversed hundreds of miles. The trained and prepared military forces of Germany had redrawn the map of Europe in a little more than four weeks. In one week the Army of the United States, gathering up munitions, rations, motor cars and wagons, was almost ready to start a wolf hunt.

Mastery of the Air.

London Times—The same command over matter which has made our ships the strongest and the swiftest that sail the seas should make our aircraft the strongest and the swiftest that race through the air. The same qualities of mind and body the coolness, the rapid decision, the discipline, the quickness of eye and hand, the dexterity, and the daring that make our sailors the best in the world have already made our airmen the best in the world. The airman, like the sailor, wants the qualities of the man who rides well to hounds. They are the qualities of our race bred in us and cultivated by our field sports and our out-of-door life through countless generations. We have the best possible materials for an air navy as invincible as our Navy on the seas. What we have to do is to set to work to recruit it in full strength, and above all to provide it at once with an abundant supply of the best machines that British brains can devise and British hands can build. Then "the freedom of the air" will be as safe as "the freedom of the seas."

Halifax Has Legal Fight on Its Hands.

Halifax, March 19—The court will be called upon to decide the legality of the action of the city council in deciding at a meeting a few nights ago to make a contract with the Halifax Power to light the streets of the city for twenty-five years. The solicitors for the Halifax Tramway Company served a notice on Mayor Martin and the city clerk that application will be made to the courts for an injunction to restrain the city from entering into a contract with the Halifax Power Company for twenty-five years.

One of the grounds on which the company intends to fight the city is based on a section in the city charter which provides that the city shall call for tenders for the lighting of the streets. The solicitors for the company also submit that the city has no power to make a contract for the lighting of the streets for a period longer than one year. The city will probably fight the company to a finish as they have been negotiating for some time to close this. The new company promises to light the streets and give a great deal more lighting at 25 per cent cheaper than the present rates. The city has twenty-one days in which to prepare to meet this move of the Halifax Electric Company.

Sir Sam May Be Made Member of British Cabinet

London March 21—Sir Sam Hughes has had a busy morning among his callers being Sir Geo. Perley and Lord Dundonald, former Commander of the Canadian Militia. The latter's visit lasted over an hour.

Sir Sam has called a conference for next week of the higher Canadian officers with regard to the consolidation of camp arrangements.

It is altogether probable that when the General visits France, he will be accompanied by Premier Hughes of Australia.

The suggestion is also general that he will be made an honorary member of the British Cabinet which he will attend with his Australian namesake.

Huns Again Use Jets of Flame

Paris, March 21—Another powerful German attack this time between Avocourt and Malancourt, west of the Meuse, resulted in heavy losses to the Germans according to the official communication issued by the French war office last night. A fresh division brought up from a distant point was used in these operations which was characterized by the employment of jets of liquid flame. At one point, east of the Malancourt wood the Germans made slight progress.

Premier Asquith Able to Preside at War Council.

London, March 21—Premier Asquith, who has been suffering from bronchial catarrh, has recovered to such an extent that he was able to preside at the War Council this morning. It is doubtful, however, whether he is well enough to attend Parliament this week.
