Notwithstanding the cold of the evening, the entertainment was attended by a large number, which speaks well for the troupe. The performance was laughable, and in many respects was first-rate. The tumbling and trapeze business of the Oliver brothers was everything that could be expected, and is deserving of the highest mode of praise.

Municipal Council.—The Municipal Council for Rear of Yonge and Escott, met in the town hall yesterday (Tuesday); all the members present. The principal business was the passing of an order to John B. Morris, to move his fence in rear of his lot on concession road allowance from the north side of concession to the centre of concession, and the passing of a by-law regulating the village morals of the unincorporated village of Farmersville. Mr. Berny objected to the by-law being passed, unless the fines accruing under the by-law be handed over to the police village fund, but the other members dissenting, the by-law was passed. We may, in a future issue, give a synopsis of the principal parts of the by-law, but think the council should have a supply printed for general distribution. An order was passed on the treasurer for \$89.23, in favor of B. Lovern, for printing voters' list and notices of Court of Revision.

A Terrible Death.—Near Chantry, on Thursday last, Mrs. Abbott, (widow of the late Thos. Abbott) met with her death in a terrible manner. The unfortunate deceased was 70 years of age, and resided with her daughter. On Thursday morning the daughter left the house, to be absent all day. On her return in the evening, her mother was not in the house, and the daughter supposed her aged parent was out milking the cow. She soon discovered, however, that such was not the case, and, becoming alarmed, began a search, and in a short time was horrified to find the dead and mangled body of her mother in a small field near the house. It is supposed that the cattle belonging to a neighbor named E. W. Sheldon broke into the field of the deceased. Amongst the cattle was a bull, reputed to be of an ugly temperament, and it is evident that the deceased must have attempted to drive the cattle out, when she was attacked by the bull and gored to death. The wounds inflicted were terrible. The face is bruised and disfigured; one horn entered the lower part of the neck, severing the jugular vein and passing on into the lungs; there is a gash over a foot long on one leg, and the body generally is bruised and mangled.
